The sum of points for grades in 7 subjects conducted in university studies: Corporate finance, Banking, Accountancy, Statistics, Financial analysis, Microeconomics or Economics, English - maximum 35 points. Grades on a different scale are adjusted to the scale of 2-5¹⁾ The grade for a given subject will be accepted by the admissions committee if the programme for the subject corresponds to the programme implemented in first-cycle Finance and Accountancy studies conducted at the UG's Faculty of Management. If there is no grade in a given subject, the candidate will receive 0 points for this subject. English constitutes an exception, as it may be documented by means of a language certificate. Maximum points will be awarded for CPE or CAE certificates or a TOEFL score of over 75 points. The grade report and the grading scale should be verified by the university of which the candidate is a graduate. ¹⁾ For grades obtained on a scale other than the 2-5 scale, the regulations regarding the conversion of diploma grades, defined in § 11 section 2 of the Senate Resolution, shall apply.
